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The Howard L. Edmonds Scholarship Application Guidelines

Beta Boule of Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, Springfield, MA will award an educational scholarship of \$4000.00 (\$1,000.00 per year for four years) to a graduating high school senior who has been accepted unconditionally to an accredited bachelor degree granting institution of higher learning. The criteria used to assess a candidate's qualifications for the scholarship will be the same criteria used each year to assess scholarship renewal.

To qualify the student must be an African American male with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better; must be a graduating senior from a high school located in Hampden or Hampshire County, Massachusetts. To be considered for the scholarship a candidate must summit the completed application, a 300 to 500 word essay, an official high school transcript, including curriculum and grades from 9th to 12th grades, a copy of the SAT/ACT scores report and three letters of recommendation.

Successful candidates should demonstrate other outstanding qualities such as:

- Leadership: measured by election as an officer for an extra-curricular organization or club, or
- Arts and Cultural engagement: awareness of and participation in the arts and cultural activities of his school or in the community, or
- Civic engagement: participation in community service, or
- Athletics: participation in intermural or other competitive sports and
- A successful interview with Beta Sigma Boule scholarship committee

The application with all required information must be received by February 15, 2018 Applications received after the closing date will not be considered. All applicants will be contacted by the scholarship committee and informed of the status of their application.

Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity is also known as the *Boule*, a Greek term meaning "council of noblemen". Founded in 1904, it is the oldest African American Greek-letter organization for professional men. The Boule's primary goals are:

- To address public policy issues that are related to the social, economic, and educational advancement of the African American community
- To develop and support social action programs that benefit African American families and communities

Beta Sigma *Boule's* theme, "Cultivating and Celebrating Excellence" reflects the *Boule's* high regard for achievement. The theme also captures today's continued focus on the need to inspire our youth, especially African American males, to raise their academic expectations and to strive for excellence in the classroom and beyond. Many of the *Boule's* key programs focus on improving the quality of life and outcomes for African American youth.

The *Boule* has more than 5,000 members and 125 *Boule* (chapters) throughout the United States and the Caribbean. The local chapter, based in Springfield, Massachusetts was founded in 1983, with 11 charter members. The membership now includes 25 leaders from Western Massachusetts in education, healthcare, law, medicine, law enforcement and social services sectors. Our primary focus is improving the opportunities and the well-being of young African American males.

Two of the signature programs for the Beta Sigma Boule include the

W.E.B. Du Bois Public Policy Series

A public forum and professional networking opportunity, held annually at the Community School of Music of Springfield. Nationally known experts share their perspectives on issues such as education, health, criminal justice and politics to provide information that may help community leaders develop locally-relevant, action plans. This program is named in honor of W. E. B. Du Bois a noble member of Sigma Pi Phi Boule, whose life and legacy as a social activist reflects his relentless commitment to civil rights and racial equality.

Boule Scholars Program Howard L. Edmonds Academic Scholarship

Education is *Beta Sigma Boule's* top social action priority. Nationally the *Boule* Scholars Program aims to raise educational expectations and performance of African American students by cultivating and celebrating their academic excellence from elementary to college and graduate and professional school levels. Each year, Beta Sigma Boule awards a four-year academic scholarship to a local high school senior and commits to an ongoing mentoring relationship with the recipient throughout his college years. The scholarship is named in honor of the late Howard L. Edmonds (1914-2010), who was a prominent educator in the Springfield public school system and a charter member of *Beta Sigma Boule*.
